




## DEPARTMENT OF LAW

**LL.B. (HONS) 3 YEAR PROGRAM ORDINANCE  
SEMESTER SYSTEM**

1. The duration of the program shall be three academic years, divided into six semesters. The examination for I, III and V semesters shall ordinarily be held in the month of December/January and for the II, IV and VI semesters, in the month of May/June on such dates as may be notified by the Controller of Examinations. A Supplementary examination for odd and even semesters shall be held along with their regular odd and even semester examinations. However, the supplementary examination for V and VI semesters shall be held simultaneously after every six months.
2. The Schedule of dates fixed in accordance with clause 1 above shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
3. The last date (s) by which the examinations form and fees must reach the Controller of Examinations shall be as per schedule issued by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
4. The degree of LL.B. (Hons.) shall be awarded after the completion of the 3 year program.
5. The examination schedule containing the dates of receipt of examination forms with and without late fee shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
6. A person who has passed the Graduation examination from any University/Institute examination recognized by the Chaudhary Ranbir Singh University, Jind as equivalent there to, shall be eligible for admission. The detailed eligibility conditions e.g. percentage of marks in the qualifying examinations, subject(s) combination etc. shall be notified in the Admission Brochures approved by the Academic Council from time to time.

Candidates placed under compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be eligible for admission.

**Note:**

The candidate admitted to LL.B. (Hons.) 3 year program shall not be allowed to switch over to any other program, otherwise the candidature for LL.B. (Hons.) program shall be cancelled forthwith.

7. The minimum pass marks for passing any examinations shall be 40% in aggregate



of each theory paper and internal assessment.

8. Each written paper for the respective semester Examination shall be set and evaluation of the answer books shall be done as per the University rules.

9. The internal assessment in each theory paper of LL.B. (Hons.) 3 year integrated program shall be as under:

Total Marks	=	20
Mid Term Test/ Seminar	=	10 marks
Moot Court: Written work	=	5 marks
Presentation	=	2.5 marks
Attendance more than 75-80	=	0.5 marks
Attendance more than 80-85	=	0.5 marks
Attendance more than 85-90	=	0.5 marks
Attendance more than 90-95	=	0.5 marks
Attendance more than 95-100	=	0.5 marks

10. The assessment of sessional/practical work (Project, Seminar/Moot Court, Mid-Term Tests, etc.) shall be made by the teacher, teaching the paper.
11. Every candidate shall be examined in the subject(s) as laid down in the syllabus and scheme of examination prescribed by the Academic Council from time to time. The fail/re-appear candidates will also appear in the examination as per syllabus applicable to regular students of that semester.
12. 20% marks in each written paper (excluding viva-voce), shall be assigned for internal assessment.

The Head of the Department shall forward the internal assessment marks awarded by the concerned teacher on the basis of class test, written assignment and its Presentation/Seminar and attendance in the classes etc. to the Controller of Examinations as per the following schedule:

- The Internal Assessment/Sessional marks should be supplied by the Heads of the Departments as per schedule issued by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
- Thereafter, a late fee prescribed by the University from time to time per candidate per subject shall be charged from the concerned teacher.
- No internal Assessment/Sessional marks shall be entertained if the same are received in the University after 30 days of the declaration of results. However,



Vice-Chancellor may condone the delay with late fee after taking into consideration the merit of each case.

13. The concerned teacher will preserve the records on the basis of which the Internal Assessment awards have been prepared for inspection, if needed by the University, up to three months of the date of declaration of each semester examination results.
14. The candidate will be allowed to appear in the examinations if he/she meets the following requirements:-

- a) Bears a good character
- b) Has been on the rolls of the Department during the semester.
- c) Has attended not less than 75% of lectures delivered in each theory paper as well as practical (the program to be counted up to the day before the commencement of the examination). Relaxation in shortage of lectures up to 10% will be allowed by the Head of the Department on the following grounds:
  - (i) self-illness;
  - (ii) illness/death of parents, brother, sister or any other close family member;
  - (iii) Any other reason beyond the control of the student to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department.

Provided that if the percentage of attendance is deficient on account of:

- (i) Participation in Inter-University, University or Inter-Collegiate Sports Tournaments/Youth Festivals/University Level Debates, National and International Tournaments, with the previous sanction of the Head of the Department.
- (ii) Attendance of the N.C.C Camps or University Educational Excursions or other extra-curricular activities, certified by the Head of the Department.
- (iii) Attendance at Mountaineering Program:
  - (a) By N.C.C. students;
  - (b) By students sent by the Youth and Cultural Affairs Department;
- (iv) Voluntary donation of blood certified by a Government Doctor of Gazetted rank or University Medical Officer.
- (v) Attendance and/or participation in the All India Moot Court/Debate Competitions;

- (vi) Attendance at the extension lecture (s) organized by the Department of Law.

Credit may be given for the number of days on which lectures were delivered or sessional/practical work done during the period of attendance or participation aforesaid, provided that the total period of absence shall not exceed 11 days in a semester and that for (iv) above shall not exceed 2 days.

15. The medium of instruction shall be English. The medium of examination shall be English/ Hindi. However, question paper will be supplied in English only.
16. The examination fee to be paid by the candidate for each semester shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.
17. The candidate shall be treated as promoted to the next semester/class automatically subject to fulfillment of conditions as laid down in clause-14 of the Ordinance.
18. A candidate who fails to pass or having been eligible, fails to appear in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the re-appear paper(s) within a period of Five (5) years.

While re-appearing to pass a semester examination, the candidate will be exempted from reappearing in the papers/ practical in which he/ she secured 40% pass marks.

19. Improvement in any examination of LL.B. (Hons.) 3 year program shall be allowed only after the successful completion of the degree and within two years from the date of its completion.
20. The Internal Assessment awards as well as viva-voce awards of a candidate who fails in any semester examination shall be carried forward to the next examination.
21. Soon after the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall declare the result as early as possible.
22. The list of successful candidates after the VI semester (06<sup>th</sup> semester for LL.B. (Hons.) 3 year program) examination shall be arranged as under in three divisions on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in I to VI semester examinations taken together, and the division obtained by the candidate will be stated in his/her degree:-



c) Those who obtain less than 50% marks Third Division

The candidates who pass the examination at the first attempt and with minimum duration of the program after obtaining 75% or more marks of the total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with 'Distinction'.

**Note:**

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of graduation or exit by way of awarding a degree splitting the integrated double degree program, at any intermediary stage.

23. The grace marks will be allowed as per University rules.
24. The Training Report / Field Report/ Project Report/ Moot courts etc. wherever prescribed in the syllabus/ scheme of examination and required to be submitted to the University must reach in the concerned office within 20 days after the commencement of the theory examinations.
25. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the program, which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the program shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall unless specified otherwise, apply to all students whether old or new.
